From the North:

Take the Canonsburg Exit off I-79.

Make a left at the end of the ramp onto McClelland Road.

Proceed to second stop light. Make a left onto Route 19N.

At next light, make a left into Waterdam Plaza. 4000 Waterdam Plaza Drive is on the right after the stop sign.

From the South:

Take the Canonsburg Exit off I-79.

Make a right at the end of the ramp onto Weavertown Road.

Proceed to stoplight. Make a left onto Route 19N.

At the third stoplight, make a left into Waterdam Plaza. 4000 Waterdam Plaza Drive is on the right after the stop sign.

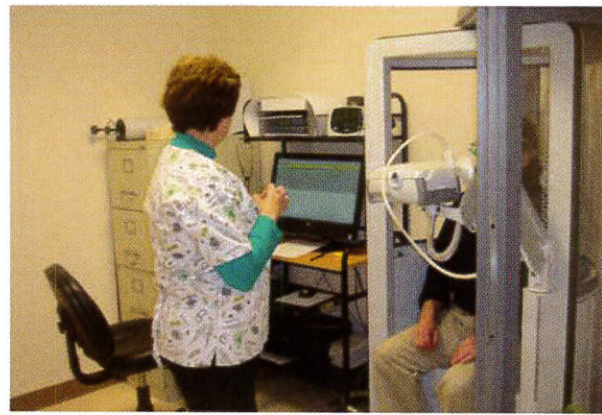

What We Do

Lungs at Work is dedicated to providing legal advocacy and health care services to coal miners who are at risk for, or who have contracted, black lung disease.

1. We provide diagnostic services and medical care at our state-of-the-art clinic conveniently located in Washington County, PA.
2. We offer education and support to our patients who are living with chronic respiratory conditions.
3. We assist our clients with their Federal Black Lung Claims by providing lay advocacy services at NO COST! We also provide support in filing federal claims, filling out the confusing application forms, gathering evidence, and preparing for court proceedings.

The Black Lung Benefits Reform Act of 1977 provides funding for clinics which evaluate and treat coal miners with respiratory impairments. This Black Lung Clinics Program provides medical, social, and legal assistance to over 30,000 black lung sufferers, and their survivors, in 14 states.

Black Lung and You

Coal is the largest domestically-produced source of energy, and the US coal industry directly employs over 120,000 people. Black lung has been identified as the most serious occupational health threat to the nation's mining workforce. Since the 1990's, the National Institute of Occupational Safety and Health has compiled data which shows that the incidence of black lung disease among coal miners with more than 20 years' tenure has more than doubled, and severe cases of black lung have recently been identified in miners as young as 39.

If you or someone you love has worked in the mining industry and has breathing problems, you should be assessed for black lung disease. Our goal is to effectively diagnose and treat you so that your quality of life can be maximized.

About Us

Lungs at Work is a nonprofit agency which has been dedicated to helping coal miners with respiratory illnesses since 2002. We are a proud member of the National Coalition of Black Lung Clinics and we work closely with the UMWA and the Department of Labor to provide miners with the medical services and black lung benefits assistance they deserve.

We have served thousands of miners and their families since our inception in 2002. Our lay advocacy services have helped our miners and their families receive millions in Federal Black Lung benefits since the program was started in 2006. In addition to the monetary awards, these miners now have black lung medical cards which will pay for all of their lung-related medical care.
